God’s Timing Is Always Perfect!

It has been a very trying fall at the Building of Hope. It all started as the weather began to turn cold back in September. The city of Ulaanbaatar has banned the burning of coal in an attempt to improve the air quality; however, this has created an extremely high demand for electricity. As the temperatures continue to drop through the fall season, the electric usage has continued to rise. This situation has created a shortage of electricity to operate our compound.

The fact that we had low voltage coming into the compound created many problems. First thing to go was the electrical components to our boiler system. Then the lighting began dimming. Anything computerized couldn’t be used for fear of burning it up. Next to go was our hot water and lastly our water system completely shut down.

We had several city and private electricians give us their professional advice. Each one was very different and their proposals ranged from four thousand to twenty thousand dollars.

We had finally come to a point that we had to run our generator for two hours in the morning and two hours in the evening just to keep the building at a reasonable temperature. Never getting over 60 degrees inside the apartments. Not a good situation.

After spending four thousand dollars to run new three phase wires directly from the transfer station several hundred meters down the road, everything seemed to be improving. It was short lived and

within a day everything began to go wrong again.

I have to say that at this point we were considering leaving the Building of Hope and waiting for spring to continue working on this problem. God again was there with just what we needed!

I made one last phone call to a man named Jim. This is the missionary that built this compound many years ago. After giving him more information about our problems he came up with a solution to try. Within 12 hours of that call everything returned to normal. Thank you brother Jim for all your prayers and advice.

God is so good to show up right on time. His timing is always perfect.
