Since our last prayer letter, God has blessed us with six new supporting churches. We are thankful for your prayers and for God's continued provision and paving of our path to Honduras. Please pray that we could quickly get to Honduras to begin the work.

For those of you who may not know, my wife was a single missionary on her way to Honduras and God brought us together. Most of the churches that supported her as a single missionary are still continuing to support us now. While in some of the northern States this month we had the opportunity to visit two of those churches so that they could meet me (and Sofia, of course!). We are thankful for every church that has made the decision to be part of God's work in Honduras through our family.

My wife often sings in churches that we visit, but since Sofia came into our lives, she has not always been able to sing as she is busy with the baby. Recently we were in a church where the pastor asked if my wife might like to sing. I told him she could if the baby cooperated. I assumed I would hold Sofia while Amber sang, but Sofia was close to drifting off to sleep, so Amber kept her in her arms as she sang. What began as a solo became a duet as Sofia attempted to accompany what she must have thought was a lullaby just for her. It became a funny story we will no doubt tell Sofia someday.

Becoming parents throws a new light on many verses of the Bible. 1 Peter 2:2 says, "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby." Sofia eats a lot of milk! We drive 5,000+ miles every month, and she eats about every two hours. If it takes us some time to find a good place to stop she can become quite vocal about her desire for milk. Watching her desperation for nourishment has given 1 Peter 2:2 new meaning for us. I'd like to leave you with this challenge; ask yourself, 'Do I desire God's Word as much as a newborn babe desires milk?' Do we find ourselves being desperate for time to read the Word? Do we value it enough to tell others about it? Something to think about.
