This church will continue to host our annual youth camp in January 2018 and family conferences in March and their upcoming conference for the Quechua speakers in November.

Once again we are encouraged by how God continues to work amongst the sons and daughters of sister Joaquina Figueroa. Her oldest son Freddy claims to have been saved when he was a child, but has spent almost his entire life away from the Lord. Freddy has developed a serious heart condition and on his back in the hospital has come back to our Lord. He has started attending Sunday services in the Tierras Nuevas Baptist Church.
