We have been experiencing a tremendous time of harvest in the lives of the Magwero students. We just have to praise the Lord! Over the past two months, twenty-five of the students have given their lives to Christ. We are so encouraged that the words we have shared over the past seven years have not been in vain.

Many of these students do not live in Chipata. And while this effort isn't going to help build our church, we are thrilled that it is going to help send out ambassadors into other cities, villages, and provinces across Zambia. The vast majority of the students live in places like Copperbelt, Lusaka, and other towns/villages in the Eastern province. Please pray for them as they soon return home on break.

Julie's prison ministry continues to go well, with the women being very interactive during teaching and worship. We recently purchased a Nyanja song book that we hope will unify the women by praising the Lord together in a common language. The women continue to share prayer requests for their children and husbands while they are in prison. Please pray that the Word of God would minister to the very specific needs and issues of these women. Also please pray for the improvement projects of kitchen renovation and providing a water pump.

The ministry in Malawi has been unbelievable. The men with the carpentry business who were saved have continued to invite people from the community to come and hear the Gospel at their workplace. Three Deaf women were saved last week, and they are inviting more today. We are so thankful to the Lord for the opportunity to minister to them, and pray for their continued spiritual growth. They are enjoying the whatsapp group I started to discuss the Word during the week.

We are so thankful to the Lord for answering prayers regarding our daughters. He has given us leads for Kat's future career, has continued to provide for Tina, as well as helping us sort out things with the pediatrician regarding their health care needs. People have also been so generous to provide things for the apartment we will be living in. We have also found a vehicle for Tina for when we return to the field, and a possible vehicle for us to use on our furlough.

Thank you so much for your continued prayers and support. They mean so much to us. We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible in the coming year.
