-The kitchen at the women's prison was completely remodeled. What a difference it makes for them! They also have electricity running in it now, but are using rocket stoves for cooking.

-The boys' dorm at Magwero got new struts and roof sheets. Before it was damaged from water and termites, and was a hazard. Now it is strong and clean. They can sleep and study in safety. Thank you for giving so we can make a difference!

-3 souls were saved in June in Malawi through Bro. Paul's efforts. Also, one faithful Deaf Malawian man named Never pleaded with his estranged wife to be reconciled. She came to Bible study and put her faith in Christ! God is at work!

-A Deaf Malawian man named Malik had been attending our church in Chipata for several weeks. We had shared the Gospel with him several times, but he did not believe he was a sinner. In July the Holy Spirit opened his eyes to his need for Christ! Hallelujah, Malik came to know Jesus!

-One of the women who was saved at the prison was released in July, and keeps in touch with Julie. Please pray for Mervis to follow Christ now that she is out of jail.

-Mike Mumba, a Deaf Zambian man, has been gathering believers in his town of Petauke. I have been mentoring him online. He is a faithful man. Please pray for him.

-Our oldest daughter Tina began college and is really enjoying her time there. Please pray as she continues to figure out time management. The Lord has graciously provided a job for her as well. We are so thankful.
