We greatly appreciate people reaching out to us during this time.

As you may know, times are difficult for all. Most churches are not able to meet, so we are praying that they will open soon and enjoy worshiping God with fellow believers. This also means that missionaries on deputation are out of work. People have reached out to us asking how we are managing, and we are grateful for all of your prayers and those who have given to us. God has provided greatly for our needs during this time. We are still eager to get back into churches so that we can get to the field and raise up men of God in Honduras.

Businesses are starting to open here in Georgia but conditions in Honduras are difficult for many. There have been 738 cases of Covid-19 in Honduras with 66 deaths as of April 29th. A total curfew has been in place and was extended most recently until May 3rd. Hondurans are only allowed to leave their home for essential things (food, medical, fuel, and hardware supplies) one day of the week, Monday-Friday, according to their ID number. Face masks are mandatory outside of homes. Only two people are allowed per vehicle. Many Hondurans do not own a refrigerator so stockpiling food is not so easy. Most are out of work. Even before the virus, many Hondurans lived day to day without a fixed income. Many are going hungry. Please pray for the people of

We have been keeping busy during this time. This first weekend of May we are involved in our mission board's Share-a-thon. We are streaming preaching, music, missionary interviews, and missions videos. All of this so that we can raise money to purchase land for the Center for World Evangelism. Our mission board, Vision Baptist Missions, is buying land so that we can have a larger place to train more missionaries. I would encourage you to consider what you can do to help that cause. We need more missionaries who are well equipped to handle the challenge of church planting in other countries. The Center for World Evangelism will give them the training they need.

I have been also spending time learning more about church planting, and I am all the more eager to use what I have learned on the field. I have been doing some research on Honduras to try to find a more specific area that we focus on planting churches. The western part of the capital, Tegucigalpa, is known as Comayaguela. Comayaguela is the poorer section of the city. There are around 700,000 people and only one Baptist church that I could find on Google maps. As God leads, I am planning on focusing on that area. I believe God will do great things there. Please pray for us as we head to Honduras to plant churches and train up men for ministry.
