## Missionaries to the Deaf - South Africa



Dear Friends in Christ,

And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; And patience, experience; and experience, hope: And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

In the northwest corner of South Africa is a small, protected place known as the Namaqua National Park. It is a semi-desert place that is nothing more than a dry, hot desert for most of the year. Few people venture to visit this out of the way desert. However, if you go there just after the rains of spring, you will be treated to one of the most beautiful sights ever to be seen. The rains provide the needed moisture to seeds that have lain dormant for many months, waiting for the right conditions to grow. Soon, there is an explosion of beauty that blankets the barren landscape in a multi-colored display of flowers. It is a sight like no other. But as quickly as it appears, the unbearable heat of the desert returns, and the beauty hides its face for another year.

We were thinking about last year and what we have all gone through. Out of the "desert" of 2020, the rain of God's grace has brought much beauty. As the rains transform Namaqua into a dazzling display of floral glory, so too have we experienced God's blessings during this time. We have had to explore new ways to increase outreach to the Deaf. And we have realized the need to improve the clarity of the teaching of God's Word to people who remain in the desert of life, whether saved or lost. Having more time to grow in our relationship with the Lord has been a great blessing.

Previously, you learned how we had gone months without having in-person church services due to the country's restrictions. We are grateful that we have not missed one meeting with the Deaf. We have had the joy to increase the amount of Bible teaching during the week. We wanted to share with you some of the testimonies from those who attend our meetings on Zoom as they sent them to us.

Resborn, a young Deaf man who is part of our Zoom Bible studies, contacted us about his need for a Bible. He lives in the northern part of the country, and there is no church to attend in his province. Someone stole his Bible, and he asked for a replacement. We sent him one that we had received from the US. He received his Bible this week and was excited to have a KJV Bible. He sent me this message and we have left his message as he sent it.

"I am going to training to reading in the Bible which was KJV. To be honest I read in the bible 5 times new testament (morning, afternoon and night) under New international verse which has gone. KJV keep it up by myself cos some where has not available in the shop. Thank you in name of Jesus Christ." Resborn

The last time we were in the US, one of our Deaf choir members met up with his Deaf friend from Zimbabwe who had moved to the Kansas City area. Mpu and his family drove down to meet us in Carthage, Missouri, to see his friend and attend the service. Mpu and his wife trusted Christ as their Saviour. Our effort to find a church that had a Deaf ministry in their area was not successful. However, Mpu and family join us on Zoom! Praise the Lord! We have Deaf people from all across South Africa who meet with us to learn God's Word because they have no church to attend in their area. We never knew of this opportunity until we were in the desert of 2020. But God has poured out His extraordinary grace, transforming this time of difficulty into a thing of beauty.

One of our coworkers in ministry shared a testimony last night in our Bible Study. Sipho said there was a man at his work who wasn't very kind, and he was concerned for the man's salvation.
