Traveling

Acts 19:29 And the whole city was filled with confusion: and having caught Gaius and Aristarchus, men of Macedonia, Paul's companions in travel, they rushed with one accord into the theatre.

Ignoring the chaos, I'm thankful that Paul had travel-mates. Can we call this "fellowship," (two or more fellows in the same ship)? There is great wisdom in God's plan of sending Gospel travelers out "two-by-two," traveling together. I'm thankful that for the two trips to Florida this month, I had Linda as my travel-mate wife, and Brothers Tim M., Chuck C., and Howard S. as my travel-mate Rock of Ages colleagues.

My first trip (Linda and I) was to be a double-blessing. We were scheduled to be with Bible Baptist Church on Sunday, March 16th, were I was to preach that evening, followed by a three-day revival meeting with my colleague, Keith J., starting on Tuesday, March 18th, at Lancaster Correctional Institution. The church meeting went on without a hitch. However, on Monday morning, I received a phone call from Bro. Keith. He had gotten a phone call from the chaplain at Lancaster CI, who said that the warden had decided to take our three-day time slot to vaccinate the inmates against Covid-19.

However, my second trip, was sans-Linda, but I had travel-mates each day for our three-day revival at Jackson Correctional Institution, in Malone, FL. Malone is around a one hour drive from Chipley, FL, where we were staying. Berean Baptist Church was our host church there, graciously allowing us to stay in their comfortable missions apartment. We had six chapel services, and two face-to-face soul winning times with the inmates in lock down. During my chapel service, I felt impressed of the Lord to teach a soul winning class to the inmates.

After clearly explaining Romans 10:9 and Revelation 3:20, I asked for a show of hands from the inmates who believed they could use those verses to show other inmates how to be saved. Most all of them said they could, and would! The next day, I asked for testimonies from them about their witnessing opportunities. Two inmates stood and gave testimony! The second man said he had used those verses to witness to three unsaved inmates; the first man witnessed to one unsaved inmate. It encouraged me much that both of these men sounded happy that God had used them! Let's pray that many others will make it their ministry to be bold, vocal soul winners; we could well see revival break out should they decide to be faithful. Happily, one inmate bowed the knee to Christ, and received Him as his Savior in lock down, on the Friday morning. I had the privilege of dealing with him!.
