The Parra family has only been living in the Olives for a few months and sister Nilsa had a small house lot donated to her and has since been able to build a precarious small brick room and has tied an old tarp to one side of the room. Apparently several of Nilsa's relatives heard that she had a "house" so now there are 12 relatives including her family of 4 living in this tiny room! All 12 are currently attending regular services in the Mount Olives Baptist Church, four of the 12 have been saved and baptized and our prayers are for this entire family to be saved and also for their extreme material needs. There are very few jobs available in this small farming community and the occasional day labor jobs are barely subsistence labor jobs.



March 20th I had the privilege of marrying a very faithful young couple from the Tierras Nuevas Baptist Church. Esteban Rodriguez and Jesie Casanova. Esteban is one of the young leaders in this church. Please remember Esteban in your prayers as he struggles with some very serious health issues that have limited his ability to work a normal job and be even much more involved in the church ministries etc.



Our church services in each church have pretty much gone back to meeting normally although the city still requires that masks be used and for those who still don't feel comfortable, we have simultaneous Zoom

also. The cost of living has made it very difficult for many church families to make ends meet. I pray that things will get much worse before our Lord returns! Luke 21:28 Says "...then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh." It looks like we may have the privilege of still being alive to see the second coming of our Lord! With the daily struggles on the world scene nothing is a surprise on today's stage!
