

Dear Co-Laborer's,

Romans 8:28 "....ALL things work together for Good..." Feb. 2012, I had my first serious retinal detachment in my right eye. Almost ten years later on May 1st, 2022, I suffered a second retinal detachment in my left eye. In 2012 my Bolivian doctor encouraged me to go to Campinas, Brazil where one of the best specialists in South America worked. I returned to the same specialist this time. The surgery went well even though I realized a little late that this elderly specialist is now very outdated in the procedures he uses! While starting the recovery process by the mercy of God, thru a dear believer in Brazil I was taken to a great retinologist who had until recently been working in the Bascom Palmer Eye Institute in Miami the same place where Amparito had her cornea transplants done last year. Please forgive my lack of communication in the last months; with my vision being quite limited it has been hard for me. My prayers and hope are that my vision will recover sufficiently to continue driving to the rural places where we work with the local churches. Without good vision I would be very limited in my mobility driving over precarious rural roads. My daughter Daniela went with us to Brazil for my most recent follow up and during that time she had the privilege to participate as a music leader and counselor a nationwide youth camp with some 500 young people. 15 young people were baptized and many consecrated their lives to the Lord. She told us the testimony of a young man who had attended the camp to

follow a girl he was interested in, but the Lord worked thru a message to touch his heart and draw this young man to find true love in the most beautiful Person of Christ! The last day of camp he decided to receive Christ!

July 10th we had 3 believers baptized: Vicente Arteaga, Ilcen de Padilla and Erika Sandoval. It is really encouraging when these new believers step out into waters of baptism.

July 17th we had a special time with the Church in the Olive not only were we able to fellowship and feast on the Word of God, but also take many donations from the churches in Santa Cruz to help with the needs of the extremely poor and needy believers in the Olives. Things like beds, stoves, clothing and food were greatly appreciated.

At this moment the whole department of Santa Cruz is in a 48 hour total lockdown with it's never ending struggle with the suffocating centralized communist government. We really don't know if Bolivia will remain open to the Gospel much longer. We can only rest in God's sovereignty in every situation.

We cherish you faithful prayers and giving for our Lord's work in Bolivia.

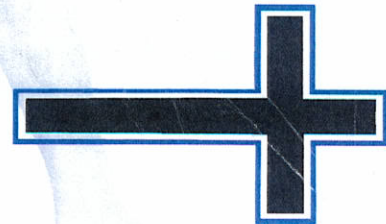

Bolivia covers an area of 125,000 square miles, the western third of which is covered by the Andes Mountains, giving Bolivia an elevation range from 361 feet to 21,463 feet, and has a population of 11,000,000. It has one of the lowest per-capita incomes of any nation in the Americas. Rural houses are of adobe or earth construction and facilities are primitive or non-existent.
