The next morning I drove 104 miles to a jail in Tennessee, I was filling in for Mrs. Peggy Ellis, and I taught a lesson on Anger and Forgiveness. One lady called on the Lord for salvation, and hopefully others got some help from the scriptures as well. On the 26th of August I went to Whitworth Prison with Janna Peacock, we had been there many times with our husbands, and we always had great meetings. The chaplain was not helpful at all. It was about 105 degrees in the gym where we had set up, and she turned the fans off. The preacher preached a great message, but the chaplain would not let us deal with those who raised their hands for salvation. There were 108 women in the room and 14 raised their hands to be saved but we could not pray with them. It broke my heart. Hopefully they understood and truly got saved. Please pray that we will have more open doors to reach the lost in these ladies facilities.
