It was such a neat week, making new friends, and reconnecting with friends we met years ago. One special moment was seeing a retired police officer talking with Paul and sharing challenges that he had faced. Before we even left, he had purchased Paul's book, read it cover to cover, and decided that he wants to help others as well who are facing or have faced similar struggles. With the ministry that we have, we have never been to a church with that many men/women in the military or have served in the military as well as first responders.
