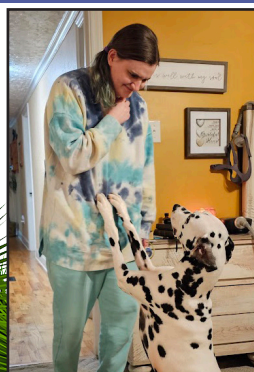
Now that grandpa is gone, CC and
