On August 17 the nation held presidential elections, which will now move to a runoff in October. The atmosphere in the country remains tense, with many fearing the possibility of financial collapse and hyperinflation. This

uncertainty has already prompted many to leave in search of stability. We earnestly ask you to pray for Bolivia, that in the midst of political and economic turmoil, the church may continue to stand strong and that the freedom to share the Gospel may remain open.

At the Olives Church, we rejoice to see God working in the lives of individuals. Alexander Luquiza, a man who has recently returned home with his two young children after being abandoned by his wife, has shown great hunger for the Word of God. He has expressed a clear desire to be baptized and grow in his walk with Christ. We also rejoice in sharing the wonderful news that six teenagers from the Olives Church have surrendered their lives to Christ, making the life-changing decision to follow Him.



We also visited the hospital to pray with Mrs. Eva Coronado Sandoval, the grandmother of Said and Johan, two young members of the Tierras Nuevas Church. After spending several days in the ICU, Mrs. Coronado Sandoval went home to be with the Lord. In the midst of this difficult time, we witnessed a moment of grace, as her granddaughter made a decision to follow Christ.
