July was a busy month for me, as we were privileged to go to Pulaski State Prison. We were blessed to see thirteen women accept Christ as their Savior. Our group was fortunate to spend a short time in a dorm where the women were preparing to go home. Hopefully they will not return to prison.

We had two ladies saved at the Atlanta Detention Center. I spoke in the Douglasville County jail, and I was allowed to teach a Bible study to three pods of fourteen women. No one raised their hand for salvation, but I pray that God spoke to them through His Word.

In August we were in a women's prison in Tennessee, and the preacher during this service, gave his testimony of praying to receive Christ but he was not sincere in his prayer to God. At the age of forty he was convicted about his sin, and he was gloriously saved by God's grace. I believe this is what happens a lot of times with some people. Four ladies prayed to be saved. We had the opportunity to be a witness to one of the officers. He listened, but he had a million reasons why he didn't want to believe. We are praying that God will touch his heart as only He can.

On the second Sunday of August, we were in Lee Arrendal. The preacher preached a great message, and five women raised their hand for salvation.

We will have an opportunity to hand out R.O.A. Bibles and material at the largest prison in Georgia during a special Christmas program. If you would like to help us purchase these Bibles, please mark on your check "For Bibles". A case of Bibles will cost \$120.00, and it contains twenty Bibles. We need approximately 500 Bibles. I do not like to ask for extra things, but I feel this is a very worthy cause and I know God will bless you richly for any donation no matter how small. We would like to make sure these women get a good King James Bible.

Janna Peacock and I were in the Atlanta Detention Center in August. We both taught a Bible lesson, but everyone claimed to be saved. We pray that they got some help from the Word of God. I was in the Douglas County jail the third week of August. I taught three lessons to ladies in the pods. It was a long night for me (I'm not as young as I used to be), but I love to teach the Word of God to the ladies in hopes that they would let the Lord speak to them. Some women are only there for a short time, and I pray that they will get in good church once they leave and develop a relationship with the Lord.
