As we prayed, their friend began to weep and told me that it was the first time she had heard anyone pray for her out loud. She is not saved, and I am not certain if Bro. P's wife is saved either. They both expressed interest in visiting our church. Please pray for these dear ladies! God gave us a wonderful service on the day following, which was Danielle's first Sunday back. God used her absence to give our church an even greater appreciation for the sweetness and warmth she carries into every service with her meek and quiet spirit, as well as all she does in the background to keep our church running, most of which goes unnoticed by many. After the service, God allowed us to hold our church's first business meeting with our official members, where God allowed us to set a precedence for how we will make decisions together as a church going forward.
