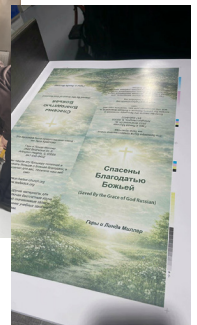

Mongolia 2026 Cabin Restoration Project

A Place of Welcome and Watchfulness

This project represents more than the renovation of a cabin. It is the restoration of a place that will serve both people and purpose. With grateful hearts and a shared vision, we are praying and seeking support to remodel this cabin so that it may become a **Resource Center** serving as a point of welcome, care, and oversight for the ministry grounds.

Our prayer and desire is that this humble structure will become a place where practical help, encouragement, and spiritual guidance can begin. It will serve as the first place of contact for visitors, volunteers, and those seeking assistance. From this space, resources can be distributed, needs can be identified, and relationships can begin to form.

The Lord has opened the door for us to begin remodeling a cabin-type building that we are prayerfully preparing to use for ministry purposes. Our desire is for this building to become a useful tool in serving others and advancing the work of the Lord. Much work is still needed, and we are trusting God to provide the materials and finances necessary to complete the project. If the Lord would lead you to help with this need, every gift, whether great or small, would be a tremendous blessing and encouragement. Most importantly, we ask for your prayers that this project would honor Christ and be used for His glory.

As we prepare for the 2026 Mongolia Resource Center remodeling project, we are carefully working through the many needs involved in transforming this cabin-type building into a useful ministry resource. Our prayer is that this facility will become a place that can serve missionaries, national pastors, and ministry workers for years to come.

Below is a general estimate of the current project needs and expenses:

Demolition — \$500	
Exterior Doors (2) — \$2,000	Drywall Finishing - \$1,500
Electrical Work — \$2,000	Outside Insulation & Siding - \$3,000
In-Cabin Plumbing — \$1,000	Windows - \$1,000
Exterior Plumbing — \$2,500	Trim - \$500
Roof — \$1,500	Light Fixtures - \$750
Small Kitchenette — \$3,000	Resource Center Fixtures - \$1,000
Flooring — \$3,000	Heating System - \$4,000
Drywall — \$1,000	Bathroom Fixtures (Sink, toilet, shower) - \$2,000
